

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Today as I completed my run, I was thankful the morning journey was finished. It clearly had a start and finish, with slow miles in between. This "journey" led me to think of other journeys in our lives, those with starting points and finish lines, and the many that have no end.

On June 4th, a crew of twelve fine young adults

moved a tassel and ended a journey. In many ways, these students exemplify the JCS journey. They have shown a high level of academic achievement, with half of the class ending their high school career with a GPA above 4.0. We had a class of servant leaders, including a "Service over Self" scholarship recipient from the Rotarians of

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Johnstown. Some students were celebrated because of their excellence in fine arts and athletics. Importantly, they sang together in worship, "I've seen the evidence of your goodness, all over my life." But my question was, is their journey with JCS completed? I hope not. As alumni, they carry pieces of JCS with them and possibly one day will return to JCS as a parent or educator. Currently, 32 of our patron families were former students at JCS and eight of our staff members are alumni. I pray they will continue this journey by remembering to pray for JCS for years to come.

To the parents reading this, it may appear my parenting journey is over, as my youngest daughter was a 2021 graduate of JCS. But, I imagine, as any parent would concur, our parenting journey is never over. As seasons of life change and develop, our roles do too, but the role of parenting is not one we remove. "Children are a blessing and a gift from the Lord" Psalm 127:3.

When I reflect on the JCS journey, Christian education on Soap Hollow Road had a starting point of 1944, when a group of young Mennonite families had a vision of a different education for their children. Daniel Glick noted, "The least we can give our children is a Christian church, Christian school, and a Christian home. Our vision is often blurred. When Christianity is minimized so

much as to leave it out of the curriculum, our youth will suffer. Remember we are investing in our youth, which is the best investment." Well said and this investment continues 77 years later. We are journeying on a path started by these visionaries. I pray we are forging a strong path for those who are yet to come.

As we sit with potential JCS families, I ask them

to tell us about their faith journey. This may include what God is teaching them now, a bit about their faith history, and much more. Often during these interviews, I have had the honor of sitting with Mrs. Cathy Spory, who will frequently comment on this continual journey with Jesus. And it is a continual journey. Coach and former NBA player Tony Bennett says, "We ask our guys in the offsea-

son: If you played last year's version of yourself one-on-one, could you dominate yourself now? If you can't say yes, then you have not done your job improving." If we look at this beyond athletics (I am not dominating anyone playing one-on-one), am I stronger and growing in my journey with Christ? Does today's version of Celeste look, sound, and act more like Jesus than last year's version? I pray it is so. Blessings on your journey.

Postscript: Mrs. Spory's comments come from the great journey she has had at JCS. From the roles of student, alumni, patron, teacher, and administrator, she has been on the great journey that is Johnstown Christian School. This year, Cathy will be altering her journey at JCS, as she passes on the role of Elementary Principal to Mrs. Melinda Hodges, but will remain teaching in our kindergarten classroom. Mrs. Spory has been an encour-

agement to many of us on our journey. Many thanks to Cathy Spory and blessings for Melinda Hodges as she leads on new paths.

Feed the Need

We held our second Feed the Need campaign this spring. Students spent five weeks asking for sponsorships as a fund-raiser to support JCS and our ministry: Engaging Minds, Building Character, Deepening Faith. The fundraiser concluded with an all-school "Packing Party" on Friday, March 26, 2021. Students packaged 10,000 meals in just four hours, and it all fit in 42 boxes. Joy overflowed in our building as students worked together to make a difference locally and globally! This year 8,500 meals were shipped to Haiti, where local Christian schools serve them in an effort to encourage attendance. While in class, students receive instruction in English, Mathematics, and, most importantly, they are able to hear the GOSPEL, all while being shown Christ's love! The remaining 1,500 meals were distributed to New Day Inc., The Big Table Dinner - Hornerstown, and Johnstown Soup Kitchen.

- 3. I view God differently: "God loves me for who I am and He sees me and wants me where I am. He sees me as His daughter and wants to spend all the time with me. It is extremely important to connect and spend time with Him in some way every day."
- 4. Things don't always go as planned, and that's okay: "Sometimes when the days get long and hard I just need to lean on Him and continue to follow Him and He always helps me get through. He has taught me to change things from 'I have to do this' to 'I get to do this for His glory."
- 5. It is important to rest and get alone with God: "Spend time with God, and then He will fill you up and give you the strength to pour out to those around you. If you are not filled up then you have nothing to pour out."

Now, Megan gets to start a new chapter and glorify the Lord in what is next. "I am so thankful for all the good and the bad that Christ has brought me through during this time. Thank you all so much for supporting me and praying for me this past year. I appreciate all of your blessings."
