From the Administrator's Desk

Johnstown Christian School equips students to understand God's absolute truth by engaging minds, building character, deepening faith, and creating community to glorify God.

This is the mission statement of JCS – our goals as we work with many young people daily. What does it mean to "build character" and how does our community impact this development?

One highlight of November is ACSI's student leadership conference. For many years, we have sent students and a few adults to Washington DC to interact with students from other ACSI schools. I have never had the privilege to attend the event with our students, but Miss Adkins keeps in contact with me through text, pictures, and quotes during the conference. This year I received a powerful oneliner, "Community shapes character." Wow, these few words encapsulate much of what we do inside the walls of JCS. Our community: teachers, staff, coaches, and many others, play a vital role in a student's development of Godly

I have been patiently, maybe not so patiently, waiting for a new Dollar General to be completed in my neighborhood. If my understanding is correct, it will be a Dollar General Market. My children are not as impressed, but this means it will include a small produce section and a few additional grocery items. It is the small things, right? I was very excited about the speed at which the building was constructed. This gave me great hope. At first, my comments were, "I bet it will be ready for me to shop in by the end of October. Then, "For sure by Thanksgiving." It was even a topic of discussion as I rode home from my Thanksgiving holiday travels. "Would the store be done? How exciting will it be to shop there?" I know, it is all pretty ridiculous and my family just laughs

at my enthusiasm. I keep peering in to see flooring, then freezers, and eventually shelving.

You may be wondering, what does the building of the Dollar General have to do with character development? I think that the process of character development is much like this build. The outward and visible changes to students' character and ours as adults are often the first to show signs of construction. The outer behaviors point to our desire to have a Godly character and the openness to allow the Holy Spirit to work at changing us to be more like Him.

I have been following Christ for a long time, the outward construction is fairly solid. My dai-

ly actions and behaviors should reflect this. However, the internal building, the unseen parts of my heart are still being constructed and changed to be more like Christ. Hebrew 4:12 – 13a talks about how God's word judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart and, ultimately, these are not hidden from Him.

"For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to divide soul

and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight."

In all of us, the journey toward being Christ-like requires community and time. Our community helps us on this journey to reflect His character and to assist us in being open to the internal finishing of our heart.

A heartfelt THANK YOU to all who gave on #GivingTuesday. The monies raised will go to the gym renovation.




Harrisburg, PA
