

## FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Familiarity has several definitions. It can describe a close acquaintance with or knowledge of something. It can point to the quality of being well-known or recognizability based on long, close association. Familiarity can be used to talk about relaxed friendliness or intimacy between people.

I was recently listening to a sermon on the topic of familiarity vs favor. Part of the premise was how often familiarity keeps us from seeing or appreciating God's favor. It centered on the passage in Luke 4 where Jesus returned to Nazareth teaching in the synagogue. Those in attendance asked isn't that Joseph's son? A few verses later Jesus says, "...no prophet is accepted in his hometown." This points to the question, did Jesus's familiarity lead those in his home town not to experience all the favor?

This caused me to pause. JCS has been such a familiar place to me for over 40 years. Do I ever fail to appreciate the favor of God in this special place? We often refer to our JCS community as the JCS family - this in itself points to a place of familiarity. A few thoughts about familiarity and JCS have entered my wonderings.

There are many meanings and feelings associated with family. These are the people who know us best and love us despite our faults. This is the aspect of JCS that causes me to say, "children at JCS feel seen and known." I consider this to be such a strength of JCS - all children are addressed by name and known personally. Staff work as a team in a truly familial manner. Unfortunately, these people are the ones we appreciate the least. Do we forget to express the gratitude due to our family members? At JCS, we have parents who support our work and have entrusted their greatest treasure to us to be part of the educational process. I was reminded at the 2023 graduation ceremony of the deep investment of our parents to be a part of JCS. At JCS, we have almost 270 awesome stu-

dents who enter our doors daily. Our faculty is working on writing Expected Student Outcomes, these are goals that we desire for our students to meet upon graduation. It refocused me on what our hope to build into students is and watching our class of 2023 affirmed to me, our students are on a path to reach these goals. At JCS,

we have faculty and staff who are so dedicated to the work they do. They serve families, students, and each other in Christ-like ways. These members of our family are definitely a testament to God's favor on JCS.

Another thought about familiarity is how free and blessed we are at JCS to openly allow the Lord to impact all aspects of our school program. This is such a familiar part of our school, that we may forget how truly unique it is. In Deuteronomy

6 the people of Israel were instructed to teach the Lord's ways to their children. "Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." This would ensure that the teaching of the Lord would not be lost as the people entered a land where the people followed other gods. This is true of our children today, we are challenged to impress God's truth on young people who live in a world that will try to lead them away from the truth. JCS is a place where Christ can and is incorporated into all we do, pointing students to truth in all portions of their day. For our Expected Student Outcomes, we discuss our desire for all we do to be centered on a Biblical worldview. This means that all we do is filtered through the Word of God. We teach in a way that allows us to integrate Christian principles into daily lessons, student interactions, and even discipline. Our hope is this raises up people of integrity, of whom there is no separation of what is sacred and what is not. All aspects of who we are in Christ. This facet of our school, as familiar as it is to me, points to His favor.

These point to His favor. As I tour prospective families at JCS, a piece of my work that I appreciate and value, I am always reminded of the amazing place JCS is.

Dorothy states "If I ever go looking for my heart's desire again, I won't look any further than my own backyard. Because if it isn't there, I never really lost it to begin with... There's no place like home." In my mind, there is no place like JCS!
